The responses will be treated confidentially.

The responses of individual dogs will **NOT** be reported or disclosed. We will summarise the responses and make them available to all in an easily understandable and clear format (percent, number, bar charts, etc..).

We will in summary only present general results and not any single answer. In our presentations one will not be able to see the results from any individual dog, nor if a dog comes from a particular kennel. Please note that, therefore, no individual's identity will be distinguishable in our accounting.

The overall picture of what the answers show is very important to the Breed Club (and thus all of us) to get as accurate a picture as possible of the health situation, and be able to modify the guidelines for the breeding of the Barbet. The answers will also be used to provide good breeding advice in the future.

The purpose of this survey is therefore to have a well-founded summary of the situation of the breed in the United Kingdom. The aim is not to pay attention to individuals.

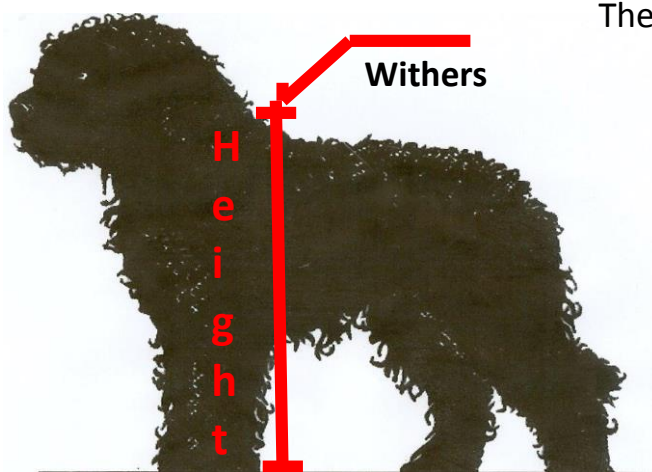

Dog's Height at Withers?

How high is your dog? Shoulder height is the distance between the floor and the withers, the highest range on the dog's back, just behind the neck, where the shoulder blades are seated.



The point on the dog's shoulders that is the highest.

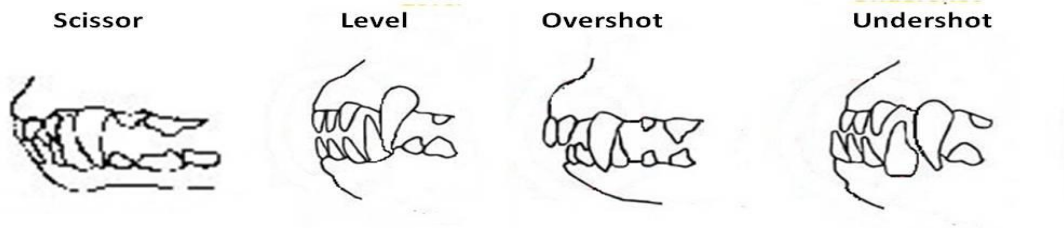

The diagram below shows the different levels of bite in your dog this will help you determine your answer for Question 3.



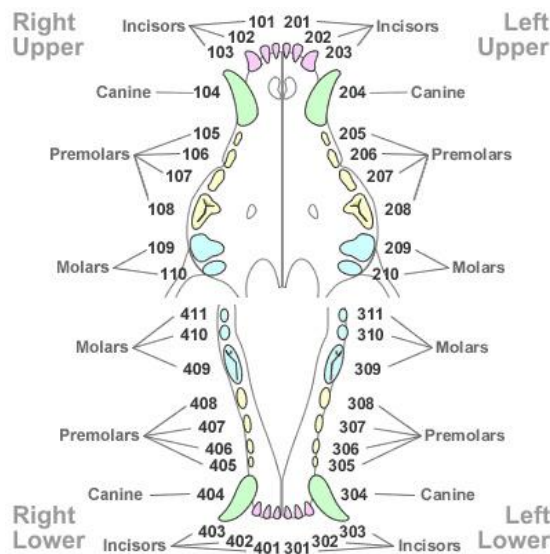
3. Bite - What kind of bite does your dog have?
